

Call for assistance: Identifying policy and practice responses to domestic and family violence under COVID-19 in Australia

Domestic Abuse: Harnessing Learning Internationally under COVID-19 (DAHLIA-19) is a new research study capturing and assessing policy and practice initiatives in responding to domestic and family violence (DFV) under COVID-19 in four countries: the United Kingdom, Ireland, Australia and South Africa. We are identifying policy and practice responses aimed at all family members experiencing DFV (adult victims and survivors, children and young people, and perpetrators) and examining which initiatives, if any, have had a coordinated approach, and which groups have benefitted from those initiatives. The Australian arm of the project is led by Professor Cathy Humphreys, University of Melbourne, in collaboration with partners Australia's National Research Organisation for Women's Safety (ANROWS) and Family Safety Victoria (FSV).  - o strengthening capacity of services and professionals
